As readers and writers, we will learn...

- * To spot and suggest rhymes.
- * Count or clap syllables in a word.
- * Write some letters with more accuracy.
- * Read some individual letters by saying the sounds for them.
- * Enjoying singing songs and rhymes.
- * Recognise words with the same initial sound.

Personal, social and emotional development:

As people we will learn....

- * To try new challenges and not give up.
- * To choose and use activities and resources appropriately.
- * To take turns and play co-operatively.
- * To respect the way that other people celebrate around the world.

Understanding the World:

As explorers, we will learn ...

- * To draw information from a map
- * To recognise environments that are different to where we live
- * To explore how vehicles work
- * To discuss how people travelled in the past
- * To understand that people around the world celebrate different festivals.

- * To practice reading and writing our new daily sound.
- * To read with an adult 4 times a week.

Expressive Arts and Design

As creators, we will learn...

- * To use different media to create a picture and talk about it.
- * To sing a simple song together.
- * To use small world and role play to explore different clothes, dances and music from around the world.

Physical Development:

As movers we will learn...

- * To develop strength and balance when playing.
- * To negotiate spaces and obstacles safely.
- * To develop the use of one handed tools and equipment—scissors and paintbrushes and our pencil grip.
